Portuguese Language in the Brazilian Context UCLA Travel Study Program FLAS Eligible

Location: Salvador da Bahia, Brazil

Dates: July 11 - August 22, 2015

Program Summary:

Make this summer your tropical winter in Brazil with the UCLA Travel Study Program! Take advantage of a unique opportunity to live and study in Salvador da Bahia, one of Brazil's foremost cultural centers. Walk the cobblestone streets of the restored "old city" and explore the largest group of Baroque buildings in the Americas. Catch a street celebration and feel the pulsating rhythms of Bahia's African-inspired music and dance. Savor moqueca, vatapá and other delicious Afro-Brazilian dishes. Study Brazilian culture while learning or improving your Portuguese language skills in this vibrant seaport.

All courses will be taught at Associação Cultural Brasil Estados Unidos (ACBEU). This program includes several excursions as part of its curriculum. A schedule of excursions will be available at a later date. For the first night, students will stay in a hotel. For the remainder of the program, students will stay with a Brazilian family. Applicants will complete a special survey to help us place you with your family.

Program Eligibility and Credits:

This program is open to ALL students, majors, and universities.

FLAS Recipients: The core program consists of 126 contact hours. To increase the contact hours, FLAS recipients may register for the optional Portuguese 199 course (Variable Topics in Portuguese: Language and Contemporary Brazil). The program includes 12 quarter units.

Program Fee:

The fee is \$6,000 for UC Undergraduate students and \$6,500 for UC Graduate students and visiting students. The fee includes registration and core course fees, housing, meals, program excursions, and insurance. Airfare, tourist visa, optional courses, other meals and optional excursions are additional.

Summer Intensive Portuguese Institute 2015 University of Wisconsin-Madison FLAS eligible

Location: University of Wisconsin-Madison

Dates: June 15 - August 7, 2015

Program Summary:

This eight-week course is designed for people wishing to study beginning Brazilian Portuguese intensively. Graduate students, faculty and other researchers, and advanced undergraduates who need to develop communication skills and reading knowledge for research will find this special Institute particularly useful. The Institute will take place during the eight-week summer school session on the UW-Madison campus. Instruction is five days a week, four hours a day (160 contact hours), and the course (listed as Portuguese 301-302) carries eight (8) semester hours of credit. The institute will be directed and taught by Professor Severino Albuquerque, sjalbuqu@wisc.edu, who will be assisted by a lecturer or teaching assistant and other Brazilian specialists. Knowledge of Spanish is required (2-3 years equivalency).

Program Fee:

Out-of-state graduate tuition is estimated at \$7800. Housing estimates can be provided by the Residence Hall office, 608-262-2522. The Campus Assistance office can assist with off-campus housing; contact that office at 608-262-2400. A limited number of Title VI Foreign Language and Area Studies Fellowships (FLAS) are available to graduate students in conjunction with the Institute.

Summer Study Abroad Program in Rio de Janeiro University of Florida FLAS Eligible

Location: Rio de Janeiro, Brazil **Dates:** June 29- August 7, 2015

Program Summary:

This is an intensive language-study program involving approximately 24 hours of class time per week. Classes are held at the IBEU (Instituto Brasil-Estados Unidos); located in the heart of the Copacabana section of Rio de Janeiro. Students spend three and a half hours per day, five days per week in one of four levels of Portuguese class. In addition, they spend from three days per week in the culture class or workshops. All instruction is in Portuguese. FLAS recipients have an additional weekly meeting. Students normally live in local households. All hosts live within easy reach of the institute where classes are held. Two meals a day are typically provided by the Brazilian family.

Program Eligibility and Credits:

Both UF and non-UF students are eligible to apply. Applicants should have completed two semesters of Portuguese or one semester of intensive introductory Portuguese with a grade of B or better. Applicants should be in good academic standing, have completed the first semester of the freshman year, be at least 18 years of age. The course is designed to fulfill 6 hours of academic requirements. Students are required to receive academic approval for their participation in the program PRIOR to that participation. Credits earned on the program transfer to the University of Florida, but grades for the language course are not computed in students' GPAs by the registrar's office. Students receive 3 hours of language credit and 3 hours for UF credit for the culture program.

Accelerated Portuguese for Speakers of Romance Languages University of Chicago FLAS Eligible

Summer in Brazil Tulane University Portuguese Language & Culture

Location: June 13 – July 25, 2015

Dates: São Paulo, Brazil

Program Summary:

The Stone Center for Latin American Studies invites undergraduates and graduate students interested in Portuguese language and Brazilian studies to apply to its highly popular Summer in Brazil program in 2015. São Paulo, the largest metropolis in South America, is an exciting center for fine arts, theater, music and cultural life. This city is a medley of Brazilians from the country's 26 states and from multiple ethnic groups, which makes for an exciting mix of traditions and fabulous food on every street.

This six-week intensive academic program is organized by Tulane and Vanderbilt universities, as well as with CET Academic Programs, and is hosted at the Pontificia Universidade Católica de São Paulo (PUC-SP). Students will have the opportunity to earn 6-7 credits and will take one Portuguese language course (beginner, intermediate, and advanced levels now offered in 2015) and a Brazilian culture course taught by Tulane or CET faculty. Students will stay with host families or in apartments with Brazilian roommates in São Paulo for a total Portuguese immersion experience. Excursions and activities in and around São Paulo will introduce students to all sides of Brazilian society.

Program Eligibility and Credits:

Student applicants must be in good academic standing and have at least a current cumulative grade point average of 2.5. Non-Tulane students are required to have completed one outside-institution Portuguese language course if they are seeking credit for PORT 2030. The pre-requisite for Tulane students to take PORT 2030 is PORT 1120. Students may be interviewed to determine their Portuguese language skill level during the application process. Non-Tulane students are welcome to apply, but should confirm with their home university that their credits will transfer. Course syllabi from previous years are available upon request.

- \$5,000: Tuition (corresponding credits) transferable to other universities
- \$2,000: Brazilian family home stays (undergraduates) or apartment housing with Brazilian roommates (graduates) with internet access
- One meal per day
- Transportation from the airport (GRU)
- Medical insurance

Middlebury College Portuguese School FLAS Eligible

Location: Middlebury, Vermont **Dates:** June 19 – August 7, 2015

Program Summary:

This 7-week Portuguese summer immersion program is part of the Language Schools at Middlebury College. During its 100-year history, the Middlebury College Language Schools have developed a worldwide reputation for innovative pedagogy anchored on the Language Pledge®—a commitment by students to speak only the target language in all situations during every hour of the day—and supported by an array of co-curricular activities.

Students will be enrolled in one of five levels according to their proficiency as determined by placement tests and prior experience with Portuguese or other Romance languages and will take 3 courses (9 credit hours). Students will also have the opportunity to take graduate-level credits to be transferred to other programs. Emphasis is on Brazilian Portuguese. Students will engage in activities that will emphasize presentational, interpretive, and interpersonal modes of communication both orally and in writing. The Portuguese School offers non-degree graduate level instruction in addition to the undergraduate program. These classes are designed for students currently enrolled in graduate programs elsewhere and whose home institutions accept the credit transfer. Students interested in this level of instruction should verify with their home institutions about the feasibility of graduate credit transfer to their program of study.

Portuguese language learning extends into lectures, films, hiking, and evening gatherings. Every week, we offer a variety of co-curricular activities such as soccer, volleyball, capoeira, yoga, dance, theater, cooking, and more. Each activity is designed to help students build new vocabulary while developing cultural fluency. The program is open to anybody who has had one year of college-level work.

Program Eligibility and Credits:

We strongly recommend that students complete at least one year of college prior to attending the Middlebury Language Schools. Applications from high school seniors whose records demonstrate the academic achievement and social maturity required to succeed in a residential college-level intensive immersion program will be considered.

The Language Schools select students for admission who show the potential and desire to succeed in a rigorous academic environment. Having previously attended the Language Schools, Middlebury College, the Monterey Institute of International Studies or the Middlebury-Monterey Language Academy does not guarantee admission.

You may enroll in courses at one Language School only, and typically only at one level of study. You are, however, welcome to apply to more than one School: to do so, you must submit a complete application to each School (including a separate application fee).

Admission is for one summer only and cannot be deferred to a future year.

Program Fee:

Tuition, Room, and Board: \$8,635; Students can apply for need-based financial aid. The School also awards fellowships through the Kathryn Davis Fellows for Peace. More information can be found at http://www.middlebury.edu/ls/finaid.

Utah Valley University Brazil: Portuguese Language Non FLAS Eligible

Location: Recife, Brazil

Dates: May 30 – June 26, 2015

Program Summary:

Recife, capital of the northeastern state of Pernambuco, is a tropical city with approximately three million inhabitants. Often called "Brazilian Venice" because of its many waterways and bridges, Recife is a large metropolis with white sandy beaches. Recife has an effervescent cultural scene, with flourishing music, dance, and cuisine. It has played an important role in Brazil's history and is now its fifth largest metropolis and one of its strongest economies. Program sites: Recife, Colonial Olinda, Porto de Galinhas, Natal, with optional side trips to Rio de Janeiro or Fernando de Noronha.

Anticipated Curriculum:

Beginning Portuguese II (PORT 1020), Intermediate Portuguese I (PORT 2010), Intermediate Portuguese II (PORT 202G), Brazilian Culture & Civilization (PORT 352G), Special Topics in Portuguese (PORT 490R), Independent Study (LANG 291R). Other courses may be offered upon consultation. All majors are welcome to apply.

Program Eligibility and Credits:

Both UVU and non-UVU students in good academic standing are eligible to apply. Applicants should have a minimum of one semester of Portuguese proficiency or equivalent with a grade of B or better. Applicants will be interviewed during the application process. Students receive 3-4 hours of language credit and 2 hours for credit for the culture program.

Program Fee: \$2,595

Classroom instruction, homestays in Brazil, group public transportation in Recife, program sidetrips, entry fees, health insurance.

Program fee DOES NOT cover: UVU tuition (approx. \$160 per credit hour), passport, visa, lunches, round-trip airfare, optional side-trips, discretionary spending.

International Studies Abroad Intensive Portuguese Language at the UNISUL FLAS Eligible

Location: Florianópolis, Brazil **Dates:** June 12 – August 1, 2015

Program Summary:

This 7-week program takes place in Florianópolis, the island capital of the state of Santa Catarina. With over 40 beaches, the island boasts great natural beauty and is known for the friendliness of its people.

All courses will be taught at the Universidade do Sul de Santa Catarina (UNISUL), a private university founded in 1964 and recognized by the Brazilian Ministry of Education. ISA students will attend courses at UNISUL's Ilha Centro location in the central downtown area of the island

During the Intensive Portuguese Language program, students at all levels of Portuguese language proficiency have the opportunity to obtain intensive training in Portuguese. Beginning and intermediate students can complete 144 hours of Portuguese-language coursework, while advanced students can complete 126 hours of Portuguese-language coursework. Course material focuses on grammar, conversation, written expression and culture. All courses are instructed in Portuguese and are evaluated on the basis of Portuguese language acquisition.

Classroom learning is complemented by a variety of cultural activities including language exchanges with local Brazilian students, a Brazilian Dance Workshop, screenings of Brazilian films, Brazilian cooking workshops, and more. Excursions to Balneário Camboriú, Blumeneau and the Itajai River Valley, and the Serra Catarinense are also included among the program's activities. Students may choose to live in an apartment or with a local host family.

Program Eligibility and Credits:

Students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.50. Detailed course descriptions are available on the website. The program is open to students at all levels of Portuguese language proficiency.

Program Fee:

Students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.50. Detailed course descriptions are available on the website. The program is open to students at all levels of Portuguese language proficiency.

The application process consists of: the ISA online application, a supplemental page signed by a university contact, submission of official transcripts, and a \$200 non-refundable application deposit.
